^{*} Franciscus served 3 months in prison. At the Correctional Institute of Ghent, Franciscus was sentenced on January 22, 1830, at age 50, to three months in prison for theft. On the same day, his daughter, Marie Therese, was also sentenced to 14 days in prison for theft. Franciscus served his sentence from April 24, 1830 to July 24, 1830, and Marie served her sentence from April 24, 1830 to May 3, 1830. What could have happened to motivate this father and daughter to break the law.

^{*} From 29 October 1835 to 28 November 1835, Jan Baptiste, at age 22, was in prison in Ghent. To this end, he was convicted of theft by the Correctional Tribunal Ghent in June 1835. Jan was 1.71 metres tall (5.6 feet), had a big nose and blue eyes. Obviously, he sported the famous 'Boerjan nose'. Perhaps he needed to steal food for his family. His wife, Colette, had only one successful birth in 13 pregnancies and she may have lost her babies due to starvation. In 1830, the Belgian provinces of the Netherlands revolted in the Belgian Revolution and declared their independence. Despite widespread international support for Belgian independence, fighting between Belgium and the Netherlands continued under the rule of King Leopold I. Belgian independence was finally recognized by the Dutch in 1839. Perhaps this contributed to bad economic and living conditions in Flanders.
