<u>Carl Gustaf Lehman</u> was probably born in 1716 (alternatively 1714) in Lingarö, Hälsingtuna parish outside Hudiksvall. His father was from Stralsund in Pomerania, the captain *Johan Henrik Lehman*, and his mother was <u>Elisabeth (Lisa) Tideman</u> (1685-1760). His brother Herman Johan Lehman (1715-1767) was a farmer and operated the parents' farm at Lingarö.

In 1738, Carl Gustaf Lehman lived in Stockholm and in the same year he married *Christina Frisk* (1718-99), She was the daughter of the captain *Hans Frisk* and his wife, *Anna Elisabet Filter*.

During his life, Carl Gustaf Lehman bought the farm, Nordenholm, in Rogsta parish in his home area and later also the family farm at Lingarö.

The Lehman couple had three children who survived to adulthood. The oldest was <u>Anna Lisa Lehman</u> (1741-1806), who in 1761 married the handler Peter (Per) Hillersten (1732-1794) in Stockholm. The second son, <u>Johan Henrik Lehman</u> (1743-77), was a mate, while the daughter <u>Ulrica Lehman</u> (1749-1826) married the Swedish colonist Per Carlsson Thunstedt (1749-1834).

Carl Gustaf Lehman was one of the most diligent captains in the Swedish East India Company. He began as boatman on the <u>Friedericus Rex Sueciae</u> 1732-33, constable on the <u>Sueciae</u> from 1737-38, fourth mate on the <u>Götheborg</u> from 1748-40, third mate on the <u>Götheborg</u> from 1741-42, first mate on the <u>Queen of Swerige</u> in 1745 and on the <u>Cronprinsess Lovisa Ulrica</u> from 1746- 47. Then he was captain of the <u>Freeden</u> from 1748-49, the <u>Prince Carl</u> from 1750-52, the <u>Princess Sophia Albertina</u> from 1755-56, the <u>Stockholm's Castle</u> from 1759-61, the <u>Riksens Ständer</u> from 1765-66 and the <u>Cron Prince Gustaf</u> from 1767-69. Then he returned to his farm, Nordenholm, where he died at Rogsta in 1777.
