† Wendla married Jacob Oscar Frans Jacobsson. He was sentenced to death for murder in 1857 but did not die until 1888.

** Thomas Elias died of chicken pox at age 1.

Olof Loström was a worker for Kalkugnskarl. The couple lived in Loggarfvegrund in Klinte parish after their marriage in 1820.

Olof was living on Gotland during the invasion by the Russian soldiers. Born in 1800, he was 8 when the Russians invaded. The memory must have been vivid in this little boy's mind. Christina Elizabeth would have been 11. The Russians were forced out after 4 weeks.

Sanda is a town in the municipality of Gotland. It is located in western Gotland, about 5 km north of Klintehamn. Loggarve was a farm in northern Sanda.

Olof died of a “disease of the breast” in 1857 – Swedish account. It is probable that he had chest pains and died of a heart attack.
